BEFORE THE CEREMONY

Degree Conferral

Participation in the graduate and undergraduate commencement ceremony does not mean your degree has been conferred. We confer degrees daily, effective the last day of each month. Once the Registrar's Office has verified that your degree program is 100% complete, we will notify you via your student email and ask you to [order your diploma](#) online. Your diploma will arrive approximately eight weeks after the conferral date. At the commencement ceremony, you will receive your diploma cover, but not your diploma.

If you have not yet received notification from the Registrar's Office, you may check your Advisement Report in [BRUIN](#) under My Info. If it indicates your degree is 100% complete, you may complete the Diploma Order Form. Please do not complete the Diploma Order Form if your report indicates an incomplete degree, as early submission of the form may delay conferring your degree. We ask that you clear all obligations to the university so we can release your diploma.

If your Advisement Report does not indicate you have reached 100% completion when you believe it should, please contact your Academic Advisor. If you have questions regarding your diploma, please contact Student Records at sssstudentrecordsteam@bellevue.edu or 1.800.756.7920, ext. 557-7386.

In addition to your conferral, you may participate in the Commencement Ceremony held twice each year in the Omaha Metropolitan area. Hosted by the Bellevue University Board of Directors, the Commencement Ceremony is the official celebration of your success. The event is open to all family and friends.

Please note: Having your degree conferred does not register you into the commencement ceremony, and participating in the commencement ceremony does not mean you have graduated or your degree has been conferred.

Commencement Ceremony Form Deadline

Starting February 20, 2026 the [commencement ceremony form](#) will be available in [BRUIN](#), please register for the ceremony by May 1, 2026. In order to be included in the ceremony, you will need to complete and fill out this form.

Shout Outs

You will have the opportunity to record and send in a video or text “Shout Out.” We will play the video “Shout Outs” on the big screens at commencement before the ceremony beginning at 8 a.m. Shout Outs submitted by Doctoral graduates will be shown prior to the Hooding Ceremony. They will also be posted online for viewing two weeks after commencement.

“Shout Outs” are a brief video clip of graduating students sending out messages (video or text) to family and friends, thanking them for their love and support. An example of a Shout Out: “Hi, Mom and Dad. Thanks so much for your love and support during my time at Bellevue University. It has been a great experience and I could never have made it without you.”

Video Shout Out Requirements:

- Video Formats: Apple ProRes, AVI, M4V, MOV, MP4, MPEG, MPE, MPG, WMV
- 1920x1080 or 1280x720, if possible
- Shoot with camera/phone horizontally
- Place camera/phone on table or tripod
- Solid color background/wall behind you
- Not handheld, if possible
- Good lighting (light yourself from the front)
- No windows or bright light source behind you
- Say or spell your name before giving your Shout Out
- Rename video file with student ID number
- Upload your video to your Bellevue University OneDrive or similar service

Text Shout Out Requirements:

- Text Shout Outs have a limit of 255 Characters
- Text Shout Outs must not contain nudity, profanity, hate speech, or adult content
- Text Shout Outs can include one photo
- Photos must not exceed 2 MB
- Photos should be in focus, contain only your face (no group photos) and not contain nudity, profanity, hate speech, or adult content
- Photo Formats: JPG or JPEG, PNG, TIFF, PSD, PDF, RAW, HEIF, and GIF
- Photos and text must be submitted to: av@bellevue.edu

Video or Text Shout Outs can be submitted between April 15, 2026 and May 22, 2026, at 11:59 p.m. (CT). Questions? Contact av@bellevue.edu.

Guests

We do not limit the number of guests you can invite. Seating is on a first come, first served basis. Your guests should enter the Mid-America Center from the main entrance on the south side. Your guests will not be allowed into the Exhibition Hall as the area is reserved for graduates. Seating for guests is accessible by stairs, escalator, or elevator, which will be available when doors open at 8 a.m.

We strive to make the commencement ceremony and commencement week activities a welcoming environment for all in attendance. Please refrain from using air horns, confetti poppers and other items that make loud and sudden noises.

Only service animals are allowed on campus and at the Mid-America Center. Please contact disability services if you have a service animal attending the commencement activities and commencement with you.

Meeting Your Guests After

Once graduates have exited the arena following the commencement ceremony, family and friends can proceed to the first floor. Please make arrangements or designate a location to meet your friends and family after the ceremony.

Alphabetical banners hanging in the Exhibition Hall at the Mid-America Center make a convenient meet-up place for you and your family, and location to return your gown at the cap and gown pick-up area.

Personal Items

Please give your valuables to your family or friends before you go to the Exhibition Hall for formation. (If you would like to take pocket-sized items with you to the dressing area, make sure to keep them with you at all times.) Once you are dressed, counted, seated by the Registrar's Office, and given instructions for the ceremony, you will not be able to leave the Exhibition Hall to visit with family and friends.

Disability Access

We strive to make the ceremony comfortable and accessible for all graduates and guests. An early arrival is recommended for guests with a disability, as accessible seating is available on a first come, first served basis. The south entrance of the Mid-America Center is an optimum location to drop-off individuals who have mobility limitations. All guest entrances to the convention center are fully accessible, featuring power assist doors. Guests with mobility limitations are welcome to utilize the elevator or escalator to the general seating areas on the second floor.

Only service animals are allowed on campus and at the Mid-America Center. Please contact disability services if you have a service animal attending the commencement activities and commencement with you.

Services for Guests who are Deaf or Hearing Impaired

An American Sign Language (ASL) interpreter may be provided upon request with advanced notice of 4 - 6 weeks. INFORMATION FOR DOCTORAL DEGREE GRADUATES

Doctoral Hooding Information

Doctoral Graduates are invited to a special reception on Friday, June 5, 2026, on the main campus of Bellevue University. A hooding ceremony may be celebrated on Friday, June 5 (prior to the reception) OR Saturday, June 6 (during the commencement ceremony at the Mid-America Center), depending on the number of graduates participating.

Final details will be communicated closer to the event date.

Participation Requirements

Doctoral candidates must have all requirements for conferral completed before participating in the hooding ceremony. Doctoral candidates will receive their diploma at the hooding ceremony on the Friday before the graduate and undergraduate ceremony.

- Meet all admission requirements
- Complete all curriculum requirements listed in the assigned University catalog
- Pass all degree-required doctoral courses with a grade of “C” or better + a maximum of six credits with a grade below a “B-” and no grade below a “C”
- Attain an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher in the doctoral degree program
- Have at least 49 credit hours in-residence courses at Bellevue University (online courses are in-residence)
- Have ALL requirements completed satisfactorily, including defense of your dissertation, at least 30 days prior to the ceremony in which you participate.

Doctoral graduates who register for the hooding ceremony will receive communications via email regarding additional information and specifics pertaining to their ceremony. Graduates should monitor their Bellevue University email and the email submitted on their ceremony registration form. Contact commencement@bellevue.edu for additional assistance, if needed.

Biographies

Doctorate candidates will be asked to submit a short biography. Submissions will be accepted until 5 p.m. on Friday, May 1, 2026.

Guidelines for Your Biography:

- Write in third person (e.g., “Jane Doe is...” instead of “I am...”).
- Include basic information such as:
 - » Who you are
 - » Why you chose to pursue your Doctoral or Ph.D. at Bellevue University
 - » Your future goals and plans

An email with full instructions and submission details will be sent to each doctoral candidate.

Nominate a Student Speaker:

Doctoral graduates may nominate themselves to be considered as the Student Speaker for the Saturday, June 6, 2026, commencement ceremony.

Nominations will be accepted February 20, 2026, until 5 p.m. (CT) through April 10, 2026. Review the qualifications and expectations of nominees, available on the Student Speaker Nomination Form.

Cap and Gown Pick Up

When a hooding ceremony occurs before the Doctorate Reception, only Doctoral regalia not picked up by 6:30 p.m. Thursday, June 4, 2026, will be available at the John B. Muller Administrative Services Building when you arrive for the ceremony on Friday, June 5, 2026.

INFORMATION FOR MASTER'S, BACHELOR'S, & ASSOCIATE'S GRADUATES

Ceremony Registration Deadline Date

Participating in commencement is a memorable event for all students. We've made reserving your space and ordering your gown for commencement quick and easy! To ensure you are registered, log into [BRUIN](#) and type "Commencement Ceremony Form" in the search bar and follow the link to complete the Commencement Ceremony form. Please submit your form either in person or online, by May 1, 2026. Failure to adhere to this deadline may result in your name being omitted from the commencement ceremony program.

Nominate a Student Speaker

Faculty, staff, and students have the opportunity to nominate the student speaker for the Spring Commencement ceremony. Candidates may be nominated from the graduating undergraduate and graduate classes. Nominations will be accepted until April 10, 2026, at 5 p.m. The nomination form can be accessed by logging into [BRUIN](#) and following:

Nominees must submit brief answers to the questions on the nomination form.

If nominated by someone other than themselves, the questions will be sent to the nominee to complete and return by the deadline date of April 10, 2026.

Nominees

Semi-finalists will be asked to deliver a 2-3 minute "preview" speech before the Student Speaker Selection Committee.

The speech will be judged on the content (unique perspective, motivational aspects, relevant quotations, and anecdotes), presentation style, and delivery.

The selection committee chooses three to four finalists to present their full speeches during the All Faculty Meeting on May 1, 2026. Full-time faculty members vote by ballot and the Spring Commencement Speaker is chosen. The student speaker is announced on the website and social media, interviewed, and photographed for the commencement program and alumni publications.

The Commencement Student Speaker will receive:

- Participation in the platform party processional and stage seating
- Photograph, name, and bio information (Provided by the Student Speaker) printed in the commencement program, Bellevue University commencement news release, *The View* alumni magazine, and Bellevue University social media channels
- Potential invitation to participate in local media interviews

Please note: *The selected Student Speaker will be required to sign a media release agreement permitting Bellevue University to capture and use photographs, video recordings and/or audio recordings of the Student Speaker in connection with commencement events.*

Commencement Regalia

Regalia is rented from Graves Graduation only for graduates participating in the commencement ceremony. The approved regalia consists of a black cap, a black gown for both men and women, and a tassel. Graduates receiving a Master's degree wear a Master's hood. Undergraduate participants meeting the criteria wear cords designating honors, if applicable. Student-athletes wear purple recognition cords. All ceremony participants who have served or are currently serving in the United States Armed Forces wear red, white, and blue military recognition cords in addition to their commencement regalia. If you wish to wear items other than the approved regalia, you will need to submit a written request to the Chief Academic Officer, at commencement@bellevue.edu 60 days prior to the commencement ceremony. If you fail to comply with standards for regalia, you will not be allowed to participate in the commencement ceremony.

Cap and Gown Information & Pick-Up

A cap, gown, tassel, honor and/or military cords and hood (if applicable) will be provided to all students who participate in the commencement ceremony. The gown must be returned immediately following the ceremony. Graduating students may keep their cap, tassel, hood (if applicable), and any awarded cords free of charge.

Please pick up your cap and gown during the following dates and times. Our graduates who have served, or are currently serving in the United States Armed Forces, will be recognized during the commencement ceremony. Please bring proof of military service when picking up your cap and gown to receive your military service recognition cord.

All caps and gowns not picked up by 7 p.m., Friday, June 5, 2026, will be available at the Mid-America Center when you arrive at 8 a.m. (CT) on Saturday, June 6, 2026.

At the end of the ceremony, please return your gown to the Cap & Gown pick-up area in the Exhibition Hall at the Mid-America Center. If you pick up your cap and gown and are unable to attend the commencement ceremony, please return the gown to OneStop in the John B. Muller Administrative Services Building, on Monday, June 8, 2026, so you will not be charged and your diploma can be released.

Honors - Bachelor's and Associate's Degrees Only

If you are a Bachelor's candidate and **have completed a minimum of 60 credit hours in residence at Bellevue University, you may be eligible for honors at graduation.**

Credit hours earned with grades of pass/fail, CLEP/DSST, PLA, New York University Foreign Language Proficiency Exams, and other transfer credits do not count toward graduation honors. Honors will be estimated Friday, March 23, 2026. You will receive a Bachelor's degree with honors if your cumulative grade point average in courses taken at Bellevue University falls within the following limits:

Red Cord	Summa Cum Laude	3.95 to 4.00
Gold Cord	Magna Cum Laude	3.88 to 3.94
Green Cord	Cum Laude	3.76 to 3.87
White Cord	With Distinction	3.60 to 3.75

If you are an Associate's candidate and **have completed a minimum of 30 credit hours in residence at Bellevue University, you may be eligible for honors at graduation.**

You will receive an Associate's degree with honors if your cumulative grade point average in courses taken at Bellevue University falls within the following limits:

Royal Cord	Highest Honor	3.95 to 4.00
Charcoal Cord	High Honor	3.76 to 3.94
Violet Cord	Honors	3.60 to 3.76

Graduate Degrees

Graduation honors are not awarded for Master's or Doctoral degrees. Rigorous academic standards must be maintained in all graduate programs. In the academic tradition, there is no higher honor than to be admitted as a graduate student and ultimately receive a graduate degree.
